- Interact with health professionals such as nurses, medical doctors, physical therapists, laboratory scientist, etc.
- Enroll in medical training program that can lead to state certification in a health profession while in high school such as Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA).
- Receive mentoring by recent college graduates through Southwest Area Health Education Center, AmeriCorps
- Learn and exhibit the professional qualities of a healthcare worker such as responsibility, honesty, patience, teamwork, accountability, and empathy.
- Learn about body systems, medical law, medical terminology, healthcare ethics, etc.
