Students earn a letter every day if they follow the PBIS Model:

S-Safe - Monday

O-Organized - Tuesday

A-Attitude - Wednesday

R-Respectful - Thursday

S- Shining Example - Friday

Caught you for Being Good

- Students earn coupons for getting caught for being good. Any staff member can give a coupon to a student or DOJO points.
- Each week, the student who earns the most tickets per classroom will be recognized by the principal on the intercom and receive a prize from the principal too.

"Take a Break"

- This is a school wide initiative called "Take a Break". It is located in a corner of the classroom decorated with colorful objects or posters that students can go to if they need a few minutes to calm down.
- Students can write down their feelings in a journal if they desire and return, feeling better in a matter of a few minutes. A timer is used by the students so they know when time is up.

Morning Meetings

- Every morning, each classroom teacher sits in a circle with his/her students to share how they are feeling.
- This is a great way to start the day.
- Students feeling connected to each other and their teacher.


RULER PROGRAM:



Attendance Policy

Excused Absences

A student's absence from school shall be considered excused if written documentation of the reason for the absence has been submitted within ten (10) school days of the student's return to school and meets the following criteria:

For absences one (1) through nine (9), a student's absences from school are considered excused when the student's parent/guardian approves such absence and submits appropriate documentation.

For the tenth absence and all absences thereafter, a student's absences from school are considered excused for the following reasons:

- A student's illness (Note: all student absences due to illness must be verified by an appropriately licensed medical professional to be deemed excused regardless of the length of absence)
- A student's observance of a religious holiday
- A death in the student's family or other emergency beyond the control of the student's family
- A mandated court appearance (additional documentation required)
- The lack of transportation that is normally provided by a district other than the one the student attends (no parental documentation is required for this reason)
- Extraordinary educational opportunities pre-approved by district administrators and in accordance with Connecticut State Department of Education guidance

If students are absent several times and their parent/guardian does not call the school or send in a note, actions may be taken such as:

On the 4th and 8th unexcused absence - teachers will call home,

On the 2nd and 8th unexcused absence – a letter will be mailed home

On the 6th and 12th unexcused absence – truancy officer will make home visit

On the 10th absence – a referral will be made to the SRBI and a parent conference requested

On the 15th unexcused absence – a referral will made to PPT

On the 20th unexcused absence – a referral will be made to DCF and a Family with Service Needs form will be filed with Juvenile detention for 6th graders.






The very first time that parents come to the site, they need to click on **CREATE ACCOUNT** and create their account for PowerSchool.

Creating Parent Account









Once you've signed in, the School Bulletin Page Appears.

Here you will see any bulletins posted for the school.




By clicking on "Grades and Attendance" on the left you can see the child's attendance and grades by period for each quarter.



When you click on "Grades History" on the left, you can see your child's grades from the School Year on the tab.



From "Grades History" you can also click on the tab


"Standards Grades History" to see the comments for each quarter


