- Anti-Bullying Read Aloud

- implement the RULER program on a daily basis and utilize the tools, including: Mood Meter, Classroom Charter and Meta-Moment. The emphasis continues to be on the classroom charter and creating a safe environment for all by fostering positive peer-to-peer interactions.

- Middle School Kindness Challenge {National Finalist}. Middle School Students have created a Student SEL Team, that pairs Middle School Students with younger peers at risk for bullying or being bullied.
- students sign "Pledge to not bully" certificates, which will be shared with the principal.

- Peer mediation
- Positive affirmation to wear throughout the day (printed on label)
- Student read a short biographical sketch of a person of peace, MLK Jr., Mahatma Ghandi, Kid President, Cesar Chavez and Malala Yousafzai. Two quotes focused on peace and kindness were read and teachers held focused circles in their classes on Monday and Friday
- Each student made a pledge as to what they would do when/if they saw bullying. The pledges were written on large paper cut-outs of sunglasses.

- Safe Touch Presentations for 5th- 8th graders

- Celebrate National National Encouragement Day for all students
- Wear Orange T Shirts from Pacer.org
- Unity Day Celebrations, a poster will be hung in the building saying, "If you knew my story, you would know that" and cadets will be given a slip of paper to anonymously write what has happened in their life.
- Interactive Kindness Wall -Students will have the opportunity to post small "post it" papers and share encouraging words. If they are having a good day then they will be encouraged to place a positive message and if they are having a bad day they will be able to take a "post it" from the wall.
