Frequently Asked Questions

How does a student qualify for bus transportation?

Students whose residence is greater than the maximum walking distance from school are eligible for transportation services. The maximum walking distances from home to school are 1 mile for elementary and middle school students (grades K-8) and 2 miles for high school students (grades 9-12). The needs of students with special needs or who live in areas where walking may not be safe are evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

How far can a student's bus stop be from home?

The maximum walking distance from home to a prescribed bus stop is similar to walking to school distances: 1 mile for elementary and middle school students and 2 miles for high school students. Parents and guardians are encouraged to walk children to bus stops and monitor behavior until students enter the bus.

May I use an alternate address for transportation purposes (i.e. babysitter)?

No, the policy of the district is to arrange transportation service for students based on the home address on file in the district's PowerSchool database.

Any modification to a bus route must be submitted in writing to your child's homeschool.

Please be aware that all children riding the bus must wear a facemask.
