## MIYAWAKI FOREST AT BLACKHAM



Connecticut's first Miyawaki Forest now thrives at Blackham School, thanks to a grant from the CT Department of Agriculture, benefiting Bridgeport Public Schools. This method rapidly transforms urban areas into lush woodlands, mimicking natural processes to create diverse ecosystems. Developed by plant ecologist Miyawaki Akira, it's vital for nurturing urban forests.

The project showcases an innovative approach, densely planting native tree species to promote rapid growth and biodiversity. Urban forests, like this one, contribute to improved air quality, urban biodiversity, and climate change mitigation.

Moreover, it demonstrates the power of public-private partnerships, with the collaboration between the CT Department of Agriculture and Bridgeport Public Schools showing the positive impact when government agencies and educational institutions join forces.

As the Miyawaki Forest at Blackham School flourishes, it symbolizes the students' dedication to a greener and more sustainable future, inspiring others to take similar steps in addressing urban environmental challenges.
