# **Physical Education**

#### P.E with Mrs. Brum

Students have done a wonderful job this quarter! We started off with our gymnastics unit. Students learned how to control their bodies while exploring various balances, rolls, and jumps. Students also learned several inversions. We began with donkey kicks in order to learn what it feels like to hold your body weight in your hands. Then we progressed to cartwheels, roundoffs, hand stands and head stands.



We celebrated the winter season with a Snow Day class! Students participated in various winter themed stations such as the ski jump, ice skating (on scarves and paper plates) and gave each other cooperative sled rides. It was a class filled with fun and excitement. In March we celebrated Dr. Seuss' Birthday by deconstructing the story Hop on Pop into physical challenges. Students hopped on Pop, played wall ball, sat on a hat, cat and bat, and knocked three bees out of a tree! We were rhyming as we got in lots of physical activity!

We also played several new tag games that used bases. A base is a spot where you are safe from getting tagged for 3 seconds. Students learned how to incorporate the simple game strategy of using a base while dodging and fleeing the taggers.We just began our striking unit. Students are learning how to make contact with a balloon using body parts as well as short and long handled implements. We will soon start our jump rope unit.

#### P.E with Ms. Riddick

Students in 2nd and 3rd grade ended the 3rd marking period with our throwing and catching unit. Students practiced throwing and catching a variety of items (frisbees, scoops, footballs, playground balls, etc.) while participating in various activities. Students were given the opportunity to practice throwing and catching with a partner/group, target throwing and throwing for distance. Freezemania, Battleship and Fire and Ice are some of the activities the students enjoyed!

We just began our hula hoop exploration unit and will be moving on to our jump rope within the next couple of weeks.

Students in 4th grade are currently working on a project called create-a-game. In groups, students are working together to create their own game which they will present to the class.

Students in grades 5-8 are continuing to participate in our sports units.We started the 3rd marking period by participating in traditional sports such as soccer, basketball and baseball. This marking period students will learn about and participate in team handball, ultimate frisbee and floor hockey.

Each unit starts with a break down of the required skills. As the unit progresses, students learn how to combine those skills with strategy while participating in a modified version of the sport.

I love watching all of my students learn, grow and have fun!!
